

An excerpt from the poem "Intestines":

Every pickled beet,
And every candied treat,
Every mouthful of rice, corn, oats and wheat,
All the veggies and all the meat,
Travels your gut for 20 feet!

Children as young as three will love the pictures, rhymes, and rhythm, while older youth will appreciate the frequent, subtle plays on words.

Your Body, Sick and Well: How Do You Know? won first place in the CIPA EVVY awards contest and the gold medal from the Moonbeam Children's Book Awards and was a finalist in the National Indie Excellence Awards. Author proceeds go to charities that support children's physical and mental health.
